- 1775 William Redfern is born in Nova Scotia Canada to Robert and Margaret Redfern 1785 The Redfern family: Thomas 22, Robert 16, William 10, Joseph 1 returned to Trowbridge Wiltshire Thomas Redfern studies to be a surgeon and opens an apothecary with John Dodd 1785 1790 William completes school, and starts apprenticeship with Thomas as a surgeon 1791 Parents Robert and Margaret move to Belfast; open a saddler on Castle Street 1792 William's sister Margaret is born 1796 William's sister Eliza is born May 25 William visited Porto Portugal on the Hibernia 1797 Jan 19 William was accredited by the Company of Surgeons in London Jan 21 William received a warrant from the Sick and Hurt Board to be a Surgeon's First Mate on HMS Standard Jan 23 William boarded HMS *Standard* in Yarmouth harbor captained by Thomas Parr; Surgeon was Robert Kirkwood May 12 Crew took control of HMS Sandwich - flagship of the North Sea fleet on the Nore sandbank of the Thames May 28 Crew took control of HMS Standard in Yarmouth and sailed for the Nore; William was aboard May 31 HMS Standard arrived at the Nore and joined the mutiny fleet of 26 warships Jun 7 The surgeon of HMS Standard was dismissed and Redfern put in charge; he submits his resignation Jun 12 Crew of HMS Standard surrenders to RN marines Jun 14 Redfern is discharged at Gravesend and imprisoned on a charge of mutiny Jun 26 President of Delegates on HMS Sandwich Richard Parker found guilty of mutiny and hanged Aug 22 Redfern faced a court martial with five other crew of HMS *Standard* Aug 25 Redfern found guilty of mutiny and sentenced to death Sep 4 Redfern's sentence commuted to 1 yr solitary confinement followed by transportation to NSW Sep 23 Redfern sent to solitary confinement in Coldbath Fields prison, Clerkenwell London 1799 Mar Parliamentary Select Committee enquires into the conditions at Coldbath Fields prison 1800 Nov 14 Redfern's name is listed for transportation to NSW Order for Redfern to be transferred to a Portsmouth prison hulk Nov 25 Sep 25 Philip Gidley King installed as 3<sup>rd</sup> Governor of New South Wales 1801 Jan Redfern taken by wagon to Portsmouth and placed on a prison hulk in the harbour Redfern transferred to a hospital hulk La Fortunée Mar Jun 6 Redfern transferred to the transportation ship Canada at the spithead Inspector-General Fitzpatrick inspects the Canada; Redfern told he will assist surgeon John Kelly Jun 9 Jun 21 the convict transports *Canada*, *Minorca* and *Nile* depart Portsmouth for NSW Aug 28 the three convict transports reach Rio Janeiro Sep 26 the flotilla departs Rio Janeiro for Port Jackson NSW Dec 15 the Canada, Minorca and Nile transports dock in Sydney Cove Dec 30 Redfern and other convicts board the Harrington bound for Norfolk Island; Sarah McHenry also boards 1802 Jan 8 Redfern lands in Norfolk Island administered by Joseph Foveaux; assigned to work at the hospital Mar 12 Hospital surgeon James Mileham returns to Sydney; replaced by assistant surgeon Thomas Roberts Jun Thomas Roberts drowns returning from HMS Porpoise; Redfern made temporary replacement surgeon Jul 9 Redfern buys 48 acres of farmland on Norfolk Island for £140 Nov 21 Lt Governor Foveaux grants Redfern a conditional pardon 1803 Jun 19 *The Sydney Gazette* announced that William Redfern had been granted an *absolute* pardon Sep 23 Foveaux suffering asthma sails on the *Dart* for Sydney accompanied by his personal doctor Redfern 1804 Jan 3 Governor King appoints D'Arcy Wentworth as main hospital surgeon at Norfolk Island Jan 19 Foveaux and Redfern return to Norfolk Island on the Union May 5 Foveaux ordered to relocate willing island residents to Port Dalrymple May 12 D'Arcy Wentworth arrives on Norfolk Island to take up the main hospital surgeon post Aug 10 D Wentworth and Redfern vaccinate island children against smallpox; but the vaccine was inactive Sep 7 Foveaux, with Ann Sherwin and daughter, depart for England on the *Albion*; replaced by John Piper 1805 July At D Wentworth's advice, Redfern begins trading in local farm produce 1806 Mar 30 D Wentworth ordered back to Sydney; Redfern put in charge of the island hospital William Bligh arrives on the Sinclair to be the 4th Governor of NSW Aug 6 1807 Apr 15 D Wentworth put in charge of Parramatta hospital D Wentworth in court for illegally using convict patients on his farm Jul 18 1808 Jan 26 Governor Bligh is arrested by the NSW Corps; the start of the Rum Rebellion Apr Redfern has a major dispute with John Piper, who banished him from the island May 19 William Redfern and Sarah McHenry depart on the Estramina for Hobart Town
  - Jun 7 The *Estramina* docks in Hobart but Redfern and McHenry do not disembark

- First Bigge Report is released to public, which cites Redfern's name over 100 times Jun 19 Lachlan and Elizabeth Macquarie arrive in London on the Surrey; Bigge's Report tabled in Parliament July 5 Details of the 1822 Bigge Report first appear in British newspapers July 27 Sep William Redfern visits his siblings in Ireland William enrols for the first semester of a pharmacology course at the University of Edinburgh Nov Dec 9 Redfern sues John Bigge for defamation in the published inquiry report 1823 Feb 7 Sarah Redfern gives birth to a second son at Trowbridge; he is named Robert Joseph Foveaux Redfern Feb 21 Second Bigge Report is tabled in British Parliament Mar 13 Third Bigge Report is tabled in British Parliament Act of 1823 giving emancipists some civil rights passed by British Parliament Macquarie attempts to rebut slander in the Bigge Report but discouraged to avoid affecting his pension claim July William Redfern sails to Madeira on the *Advertiser* to purchase grape vines and enlist a vintner 1824 Feb 19 Sarah Redfern and family sail on the Alfred for NSW via Madeira to pick up William; W Wentworth also on board Apr 2 the Alfred picks up William and the Serown vintner family and sails for NSW Jul 1 Macquarie dies on the Isle of Mull, aged 62 Redfern family arrives back in Sydney on the Alfred Jul 24 Oct 14 William Wentworth and Robert Wardell launch The Australian newspaper Nov 7 Farewell dinner to Thomas Brisbane partly organised by Redfern Nov 29 Thomas Brisbane departs Sydney for England and Scotland 1825 Mar 10 William's brother Robert Redfern arrives in Sydney on the Phoenix Dec 18 Ralph Darling becomes the 7<sup>th</sup> Governor of NSW Redfern on a delegation presenting a rights address to Governor Darling 1826 Jan 2 Redfern family take up resident in part of Simeon Lord's mansion in Macquarie Place Sydney Jan Jun 3 Redfern announces in The Sydney Gazette the opening of a private practice in Mrs Waple's, Pitt Street Jun 26 James Bowman proposes a free medical dispensary for the poor attended by government surgeons Sep Redfern closes his practice and returns to the Campbellfield farm A free publicly-funded medical dispensary for the poor opens on Macquarie Street 1827 Jan Jan 26 Large public meeting involving Redfern supports new petition to the Crown for further rights May Redfern sells part of his Campbellfield livestock for £25,000 Julv 7 D'Arcy Wentworth dies of influenza at his Homebush house in Parramatta July 27 Redfern re-elected to the board of *The Bank of New South Wales* Nov 23 Redfern assaults The Sydney Gazette editor Robert Howe over repeated insults in the newspaper Nov 26 Redfern charged with assault and given bail 1828 Jan 21 Redfern appears before the Court of Quarter Sessions; found guilty of assaulting Howe and fined £50 Feb 15 A court rules that Horatio Wills must resume his apprenticeship with Robert Howe or go to gool Mar 9 Redfern and son William depart on the Orelia for England Jul 23 The Orelia docks in London and Redfern and son William reside in Grove Street in Camden Town William Jr contracts measles and convalesces in London Sep Redfern becomes a shareholder in the new University of London 0ct 1829 Jan Redfern and son William move to Edinburgh and reside in Moray Place William Jr starts attending the Royal High School in Edinburgh Jun Jun Redfern hears from Sarah that a splinter from an accident has infected her leg, and she cannot travel Redfern enrolls for medical course at the University of Edinburgh Oct 1830 Feb Redfern and son William move to 18 Lothian Street in Old Edinburgh to be close to the university His youngest son Edward dies in Sydney aged 7; hears of his death from a devastated Sarah in late July Apr 9 His brother Joseph's daughter Selina dies in Belfast aged 18 May Oct William Jr leaves the Royal High School and is enrolled at Edinburgh Academy in Henderson Row, New Town Dec 9 Edward Wills commits suicide in London after suffering from mental illness Redfern treats his son for an eyeball injury incurred in a school ruckus 1831 Apr Redfern completes his 2<sup>nd</sup> year of medical studies at the University of Edinburgh; he stops attending Jul 1832 Jul High Court in Sydney reverses ruling that George Howe's will was unaffected by Sarah Wills' prenuptial agreement Redfern had a miniature portrait painted by George Maher and he sends it to Sarah Aug Oct 31 Redfern responds to Horatio Wills' request for advice (William Redfern's last recorded letter) 1833 Mar 10 Sarah Redfern departs on the *Norfolk* for England Redfern advised that death was near and he should update his will; he arranges for his own burial Jul William Redfern dies at 18 Lothian Street Edinburgh Jul 17 The Norfolk docks in London and Sarah sails immediately to Edinburgh Jul 22 Jul 23 William Redfern is interred at the New Calton Burial Ground Jul 25 Sarah Redfern arrives in Edinburgh; she and William Jr visit Redfern's grave Dec News of William Redfern's death reaches Sydney
  - Dec 26 A tribute to William Redfern by Horatio Wills appears in *The Sydney Gazette*
