- Abraham, Esther**, Emancipist; partner of Lieutenant Governor George Johnston
- Agnew, James**, Co-prisoner of Andrew Thompson in the Jedburgh prison
- Aitkin, John**, Yetholm weaver; co-accused of robbery with Andrew Thompson
- Amos, Thomas**, Colonial lawyer engaged to recover Thompson's outstanding loans
- Antill, Henry**, Captain, Aide de Camp of Gov. Macquarie; later Executor of Thompson's will
- Archer, Mary**, Emancipist who informed on men who murdered two aboriginal youths
- Argyll, Duke of**, Landlord of Lachlan Macquarie's father on the Isle of Mull
- Arndell, Thomas**, Surgeon and later Magistrate at Green Hills
- Arnold, Joseph**, Naval Surgeon came to colony with Macquarie; socialite and gossip
- Atkins, Richard**, Judge Advocate and enemy of John Macarthur; he was often in debt
- Baker, William**, Government storekeeper at the Hawkesbury since 1795
- Balmain, William**, Landowner of properties Thompson purchased
- Banks, Sir Joseph**, Royal Botanist; friend of William Bligh and influential in Colonial Office
- Barrington, George**, Emancipist Chief Constable at the Toongabbie Government Farm
- Bathurst, Henry**, British Colonial Secretary in 1819
- Baxter, William**, Landowner of property Thompson purchased as *Wardle Bank* in 1806
- Bayliss, Joseph**, Landowner of property Thompson purchased as *Glasgow* in 1806
- Bayly, Nicholas**, NSW Corps officer who sold Thompson the racehorse *Kangaroo*
- Beasley, Charles**, Licensee fined by Magistrate Thompson for not having a Green Hills permit
- Bell, Archibald**, NSW Corps Commandant at Green Hills; later Magistrate
- Bellasis, George**, Emancipist; Commandant of Gov. King's Cavalry and artillery unit at Dawes Point
- Bennet, Henry Gray**, British Parliamentarian and opponent of Gov. Macquarie
- Bent, Ellis**, Judge Advocate who arrived in the colony with Gov. Macquarie in 1809
- Bent, Jeffery**, First Supreme Court Judge in colony and bother of Ellis
- Bevan, David**, Auctioneer who sold land from Thompson's house in 1806
- Bigge, Thomas**, British Parliament Commissioner appointed to investigate colonial governance
- Biggers, Thomas**, Emancipist, floods rescuer; Trustee of the Nelson Common in 1803
- Black, John**, Ship officer and former companion of emancipist Mary Hyde
- Bladdey, William**, Constable at Green Hills and witness to signing of Thompson's will
- Blaxcell, Garnham**, Bought Thompson's sloop *Hope*; later as a rebel raided the Government Store
- Blaxland, Gregory**, Freeman who complained of Gov. Bligh; pallbearers at Thompson's funeral
- Blaxland, John**, Brother of Gregory
- Bligh, William**, 4th Governor of NSW; arrested in 1808 in the Rum Rebellion
- Blund, James**, Bought Thompson's farm *Creek Retreat*
- Bowman, John**, Landowner in Hawkesbury district and petitioner of Gov. Bligh
- Brabyn, John**, NSW Corps Lieutenant and member of court bench at 1808 trial of John Macarthur
- Bradbury, John**, Borrowed £35 from Andrew Thompson in 1808
- Braddick, John**, Thompson's purchasing agent in London
- Brazil, John**, Assigned convict servant who was shot dead during a robbery in August 1808
- Brennan, John**, Assisted in collecting signatures of those who supported the 1808 rebellion arrest
- Brisbane, Thomas**, 6th Governor of NSW

Brooks, Richard, Captain of the *Rose* who supported the Bligh Loyalists
Brown, David, Emancipist Constable at Green Hills
Bryan, Thomas, Servant of Thompson sentenced to corporal punishment for stealing
Buckleuch, Duke of, Appealed for royal mercy to the Home Office for Thompson's parents
Burman, Richard, Constable at Green Hills while Thompson was Chief Constable
Burns, Robert, Scottish poet and Bard greatly admired by Thompson
Butler, William, Settler found guilty of murdering two aborigines in 1799 but only fined
Camden, Lord of, Colonial Secretary in 1805
Campbell, John, Purchased Thompson's *Agnes Bank* farm in 1815 for £500
Campbell, Robert, Prominent merchant and shipper in Sydney and later Magistrate
Cartwright, Robert, Anglican chaplain in the Hawkesbury district in 1808
Castlereagh, Lord of, Chief Secretary of Ireland; later Colonial Office Secretary
Chalker, William, Hawkesbury settler who rescued several people during the 1806 floods
Chapman, William, Leaseholder for land next to Ellen Moore Sydney plot
Chisholm, James, Purchased Thompson's St Andrews farm for £1300 in 1820
Cleaveland, Thomas, Accompanied Gov. Macquarie on the 1810 inspection of farms
Clifton, Richard, Convict servant of Thompson accused of stealing pigs; acquitted
Collins, David, First Fleet Judge Advocate; later Lt Gov. of settlement at Hobart Town
Cosdale, William, Emancipist farmer at Canning Reach on the Hawkesbury with John Kelly
Cox, James, Pallbearer at Thompson's funeral
Cox, William, NSW Corps Paymaster and owner of *Argyle Farm*
Crossley, George, Solicitor, attorney and prominent emancipist settler at Hawkesbury
Cummings, William, Prominent emancipist settler at the Hawkesbury
Cunningham, Philip, Irish rebellion leader at Castle Hill in 1804; hanged in Green Hills
Dalton, Elizabeth, Convict companion of Thomas Arndell; they married in 1807
Daveney, Thomas, Superintendent at Toongabbie Government farm
Davis, James, Executed at Green Hills in 1810
Davoren, Lawrence, Irish convict who wrote the satirical song "A New Song:..."
Divine, Nicholas, Superintendent on Bligh's witness list for the 1811 trial in England
Dixon, James, Catholic priest appointed to official post by Gov. King
Dore, Richard, Judge Advocate at 1799 trial of settlers for murder of Aborigines
Dorlong, Dominicus, Mathematical instrument maker escaped the *Pitt* in Cape Town
Douglas, George Sir, MP for Roxburghshire pleaded for mercy on Thompson's sentence
Dowling, George, Witness who accompanied Bligh for the 1811 trial in England
Driver, John, Lessee of Sydney land converted by Joseph Foveaux to freehold
Dundas, Henry, Home Office Secretary refused clemency for Thompson in 1792
Dyer, George, Wrote the preamble to George Thompson's book on Toongabbie Farm
Eagar, Edward, Emancipist lawyer, acted for executors in recovering Thompson's loans in 1815
Either, Thomas, Borrowed £37 from Thompson, secured by his farm
Eivers, Mark, Charged with Robert Rope of murdering John Brazil, and acquitted
Ely, John, Quartermaster on the *Pitt*; escaped in Cape Town with convict Anne Collin
Evans, George, Freeman and loyalist settler in the Hawkesbury district
Everingham, Matthew, Emancipist settler who bought Thompson's *West Hill* farm
Faa, Johnnie, Gypsy leader in Kirk Yetholm granted protection by James V in 1570
Field, Barron, Judge in NSW Supreme Court in 1810s
Finucane, James, Lieutenant in NSW Corps and Joseph Foveaux's Adjutant

Fitz, Robert, Rebel on Gov. Bligh's list of people not permitted to leave the colony
Fitzgerald, Richard, Emancipist landholder; Gov. official and Chief Constable at Hawkesbury
Foveaux, Joseph, Officer in NSW Corps; Lt Gov of Norfolk and of NSW colony during rebellion
Frazier, Andrew, Emancipist baker and servant of Commissary Palmer
Freebody, Simon, Settler found guilty of murdering two aborigines in 1799 but only fined
Fulton, Henry, Emancipist Anglican chaplain and supporter of Bligh; present at his arrest in 1808
Gannan, Patrick, Irish convict escaped Castle Hill in 1803 injured settlers; hanged in Green Hills
Gaudry, William, Auctioneer and Henry Kable's brother-in-law; auctioned Thompsons effects
Gibbons, Matthew, Lead authors in petition to Gov Bligh for support after 1806 floods
Gillespie, John, Business partner of William Thompson in merchandising muslin textiles
Goodall, William, Settler and ex-Sergeant who was wounded by Aborigines on the Hawkesbury Road
Gore, William, Provost Marshal and ally of Bligh; arrest by John Macarthur and sent to coal mines
Gowen, John, Superintendent of Stores and supporter of Bligh; investigated by Rebels
Gray, John, Leased Thompson's Toll Bridge in 1811
Grierson, George, Dublin owner of clothing pawned by Ellen Moore's staff in 1798
Griffin, Edmund, Secretary to Gov Bligh; present during the 1808 rebellion arrest
Griffiths, Jonathan, Owner of the sloop *Speedy* which traded on the Hawkesbury
Grimes, Charles, Rebel who interrogated Thompson following Bligh's 1808 arrest
Grogan, Christopher, Irish mutineer on the *Anne* in 1800; received flogging of 250 lashes
Grono, John, Shipwright on Hawkesbury; captain of the *Speedwell*; sailed for Thompson
Grose, Francis, Major in NSW Corps; Lt Gov until John Hunter became Gov in 1795
Hailes, Lord Judge - Sir David Dalrymple, Jedburgh Assize Judge at Andrew Thompson's trial 1790
Harris, John, Emancipist innkeeper of the Cross Keys Inn, Green Hills government precinct
Harris, John, Surgeon Officer in the NSW Corps
Hassall, Rowland, Owner of private retail store in Parramatta
Hawkesbury, Lord of, Secretary of the Home Office in 1787
Haydock, Mary, Emancipist married Thomas Reibey; successful shippers; she is on the \$20 banknote
Haydon, William, Emancipist hired by Thompson to be onsite manager of Blighton farm
Hayes, Sir Henry Browne, Emancipist sent to Newcastle mines for condemning the rebellion
Hervey, James, English clergyman and author of *Meditations and Contemplations*
Hill, Richard, Constable in the Hawkesbury district
Hobart, Lord of, Secretary of the Home Office in 1802
Hobby, Thomas, Lieutenant in NSW Corps; Commandant of the Hawkesbury detachment in 1799
Hodgkinson, Thomas, Hawkesbury settler killed by Aborigines in 1799
Hogg, Abraham, Servant of Yetholm constable George Kerr who took Thompson to Jedburgh gaol
 Holding, Lawrence, Accused of stealing from Charles Palmer's house; later acquitted
Hook, Charles, Charged in 1809 with John Palmer of distributing Bligh's ship proclamation
Howard, John, 18th century prison reformer in Britain
Howe, George, Emancipist editor of *The Sydney Gazette* 1803-
Howe, John, Secretary and Manager of Andrew Thompson's estate
Howell, John, Owner of 200 acres on the Nepean purchased by Thompson in 1803
Hunter, John, 2nd Governor of NSW; Captain Royal Navy and HMS *Sirius* in the First Fleet
Hyde, Mary, Companion and later married to Simeon Lord
Ikin, Obadiah, Ex-officer in NSW Corps who became a settler in the Hawkesbury district
Ivory, Thomas, Licensee fined by Magistrate Thompson for not having a correct permit
Jamieson, John, Superintendent from Parramatta who helped capture Irish escapees

Jenkins, James, Borrowed from Thompson to invest in shipping industry
Jenkins, William, Brother of James; borrowed from Thompson to invest in shipping industry
Johnston, George, Major NSW Corps; Commandant who arrested Bligh; later court martialled
Johnston, William, Bought Thompson's sloop the *Speedwell* in December 1810
Jones, Thomas, Receiver of a £50 promissory note from Thompson in 1807
Jordan, William, Yetholm man appointed to oversee court protection of William Thompson family
Kable, Henry, Emancipist trader supporting John Macarthur in the arrest of Gov Bligh
Kean, Bridget, Murdered by William Miller in 1805
Kearns, Matthew, Emancipist landowner and businessman in Sydney who acted for Thompson
Kelly, John, Emancipist shipwright at Canning Reach Hawkesbury who built the sloop *Hope*
Kemp, Anthony, Lieutenant in NSW Corps; Commandant in Green Hills in 1798
Kent, Thomas, Sydney merchant member of 1809 consortium to grow flax in NZ
Kerr, George, Yetholm constable who arrested Andrew Thompson in 1790
King, Anna Josepha, Wife of Philip Gidley King
King, Philip Gidley, 3rd Governor of NSW; Captain Royal Navy
Larra, James, Emancipist businessman in Parramatta, had offices for hire
Lawson, William, Lieutenant NSW Corps; member of court bench at Macarthur's 1808 trial
Laycock, Thomas, Lieutenant NSW Corps; member of court bench at Macarthur's 1808 trial
Lindsey, William, Convict servant of Thompson accused of stealing sheep from John Palmer
Liverpool, Earl of, Secretary of the Colonial Office in 1810
Lock, Matthew, Constable at Green Hills; later Chief Constable when Thompson was Magistrate
Lord, Simeon, Emancipist merchant; later appointed Magistrate; benefited from Thompson's estate
Macarthur, Elizabeth, Wife of John Macarthur and sheep breeder
Macarthur, John, Captain NSW Corps; wrote arrest warrant for Bligh; declared enemy of Thompson
Macarthur, John Junior, Son of John and Elizabeth Macarthur
Maclaine, Murdoch, Lachlan Macquarie's uncle who supported him after his father's death in 1785
Macquarie, Charles, Brother of Lachlan Macquarie
Macquarie, Elizabeth, Second wife of Lachlan Macquarie
Macquarie, Lachlan, 5th Governor of NSW; friend of Thompson and benefited from his will
Mann, David, Emancipist appointed by Gov King to official posts
Manning, Edward, Captain of the *Pitt* that transported convicts to NSW arriving in 1792
Marsden, Samuel, Senior Anglican Minister in Parramatta; sometime Magistrate
Mason, Martin, Surgeon at Green Hills and Bligh loyalist; accompanied him to England for 1811 trial
McDougal, William, Apprentice weaver to William Thompson; witness at Andrew's trial in 1790
McKellar, Neil, Lieutenant NSW Corps; joint Commandant at Green Hills in 1795
McLane, Mary, Found guilty of stealing from Charles Palmer's house; sent to Norfolk Island
McLaughlane, Thomas, Found guilty of stealing from Palmer's house; hanged at Green Hills 1803
McLeece, Daniel, Borrowed £125 from Thompson in 1808 using a ship and house as security
Mealing, John, Convict servant of Thompson found guilty of stealing pigs
Meehan, James, Emancipist appointed by Gov King to official posts
Metcalfe, James, Settler found guilty of murdering two aborigines in 1799 but only fined
Mileham, James, Surgeon in the Hawkesbury district; treated Thompson in 1809-10
Miller, William, Found guilty of murdering Bridget Keane and was hung
Minchin, William, Lieutenant NSW Corps; member of court bench at Macarthur's 1808 trial
Moore, Eleanor (Ellen), Emancipist dressmaker in Sydney; believed companion of Thompson
Moore, Thomas, Shipwright on the Hawkesbury; friend of Thompson and Executor of his will

Moore, William, Lieutenant NSW Corps; member of court bench at Macarthur's 1808 trial
Moos, Isaac, Borrowed £5 from Thompson in 1808
Morris, John, Drowned in the 1806 Hawkesbury floods
Mortimer, William, Assigned convict to Thompson; later Emancipist overseer for Thompson
Murray, John, Captain 73rd Highland Regiment of Foot made Magistrate at Parramatta in 1810
Murray, Robert, Settler who bought Thompson's land on Scotland Island
Nichols, Isaac, Emancipist private landowner with over 300 acres
Nightingall, Miles, General appointed 5th Governor of NSW but declined because of ill health
Noah, William, Convict transported to NSW wrote a diary in 1797 of the voyage
Nobbs, Joseph, Settler who bought Thompson's *Agnes Bank* farm for £80
O'Connell, Maurice, Captain 73rd Highland Regiment of Foot, Lieutenant Governor 1809
Oakes, Francis, Chief Constable at Parramatta sacked by rebels in 1808
Palmer, Charles, Brother of John; farmhouse robbery investigated by Thompson in 1803
Palmer, George, Provost Marshal in 1810; son of John
Palmer, John, Commissary for colony and major farmer at the Hawkesbury
Paterson, William, Lt Gov from Dec 1794 to Sep 1795 and from Jan to Dec 1809
Perkins, James, Convict servant of Thompson accused of stealing pigs; acquitted
Phillip, Arthur, 1st Governor of NSW; Commander of the First Fleet in 1787-88
Pitt, Thomas, Hawkesbury settler and lead author of an 1806 petition to Gov Bligh
Pitt, William, British Prime Minister 1783-1802
Porteous, John, Captain Royal Navy, Commander of HMS *Porpoise*; Loyalist of Bligh
Portland, Duke of, Secretary of the Home Office in 1798
Powell, Edward, Constable found guilty of murdering Aboriginal youths in 1799; was dismissed
Putland, John, Lieutenant Royal Navy; husband of Bligh's daughter Mary; died in 1807
Putland, Mary, Daughter of Gov Bligh; later married Maurice O'Connell
Rae, John, Yetholm resident; witness at Andrew's 1790 trial; threatened William Thompson family
Randall, Thomas, Neighbour of Thompson's Sydney house in Macquarie Place
Redfern, William, Emancipist surgeon and Magistrate; treated Thompson in 1810
Redman, John, Chief Constable in Sydney; dismissed by Rebels; reappointed by Macquarie
Redmond, Edward, Bought Thompson's *Killarney* farm in 1815
Reibey, Mary, Emancipist wife of Thomas; she is on the \$20 banknote
Reibey, Thomas, Prominent shipper and neighbour of Thompson in Sydney; Thompson pallbearer
Richardson, Cuthbert, Captain of the *Albion* who conveyed Bligh's dispatches to England
Richie, Robert, Emancipist settler on the South Creek
Rickerby, Thomas, Chief Constable at Green Hills when Thompson was a constable
Riley, Alexander, Businessman in Sydney who later accused Thompson of fathering many children
Riley, Barnaby, Made Chief Constable of Parramatta by Macarthur for helping with the rebellion
Rope, Robert, Employee of Thompson accused of shooting John Braxil during a robbery; acquitted
Rouse, Richard, Superintendent who accompanied Bligh as a witness to the 1811 trial
Rowley, Thomas, Captain NSW Corps was assigned Simeon Lord as a servant
Roxburghe, Duke of, Major landholder in Scottish border towns around Kelso
Ruse, James, First Fleet settler and major landholder who witnessed Thompson's will
Rushton, Thomas, Emancipist who purchased the government brewery in Parramatta
Ryan, John, Hawkesbury Constable when Thompson was Chief Constable
Sheehy, Marcus, Mutineer leader on the *Anne* in 1800 who was executed by firing squad
Sherwin, Ann, Companion of Joseph Foveaux, who he later married in England

Sherwin, William, Sergeant NSW Corps who arrived on the *Pitt* as the husband of Ann Sherwin
Shortreed, Robert, Messenger for the Jedburgh Court Advocate Norris in 1790
Simpson, Francis, Irish convict at Castle Hill farm who in 1803 escaped and raided settlers; hanged
Smith, James, One of Thompson's three emancipist clerks
Soare, John, Hawkesbury Constable when Thompson was also elected Constable
Speed, John, One of Thompson's three emancipist clerks in 1810
Spital, John, Employee of Thomson implicated in the 1805 charge of stealing pigs
Sterne, Lawrence, Irish born novelist who wrote *A Sentimental Journey Through France and Italy*
Stewart, Robert, Escaped with 50 convicts to the Philippines on the brig *Harrington*
Stogdell, John, Emancipist farmer largest landholder in Hawkesbury but drowned in the 1801 flood
Story, George, Yetholm school master who taught Andrew Thompson
Suttor, George, Settler from Baulkham Hill; Bligh loyalist and witness at the 1811 trial in England
Sweet, George, Business partner of William Thompson in their textile merchandising firm in 1789
Symons, James, Captain NSW Corps sent with Rebel dispatches to England; arrested enroute
Tench, Watkin, Captain in Royal Marines aboard First Fleet; important chronicler of early colony
Terry, Samuel, Purchased for £120 Thompson's Green Hills barracks in 1817
Thompson, Agnes, Mother of Andrew
Thompson, Charles, Son of Andrew's nephew John
Thompson, George, Visited colony in 1792; wrote *Slavery & Famine, Punishment for Seditions*
Thompson, Jean, Niece of Andrew
Thompson, John, Father of Andrew
Thompson, John, Nephew of Andrew
Thompson, John, Son of Andrew's nephew John
Thompson, Margaret, Sister of Andrew

Tweeddale, Marquis of, Laird of the land that included Kirk Yetholm
Tweedie, William, Convict from Jedburgh gaol who escaped the *Pitt* in Rio de Janeiro
Tyler, Thomas, Elected by settlers to be a Trustee of the Nelson Common
Underwood, James, Co-owner of the sloop *Surprise* that competed with Thompson's ships
Usher, Thomas, Court Sheriff in Jedburgh who took Andrew Thompson's declaration
Verdie, Eleanor, Female servant of William Thompson; girlfriend of weaver John Aitken
Walker, John, Surgeon in Yetholm appointed cautioner for the William Thompson family
Ward, Joseph, Emancipist manager of Thompson's St Andrews farm
Watling, Thomas, Emancipist who became one of the colony's best known watercolourists
Wauchope, Laird of Niddrie, Landholder of the district including the village Town Yetholm
Wayham, Thomas, Purchased Thompson's *Glasgow* farm on the Nepean River in 1815

Webb, James, Shipbuilder at Canning Reach on the Hawkesbury River
Wentworth, D'Arcy, Surgeon of the Sydney hospital; accompanied Macarthur to arrest Bligh 1808
White, John, Chief Surgeon on the First Fleet; employed Watling to paint landscapes
Whitehouse, James, Granted land on the western border of the Green Hills government precinct
Whittle, Thomas, Sergeant NSW Corps commissioned cartoon of Bligh dragged from under bed
Wilberforce, William, British parliamentarian largely responsible for ending the slave trade
Wilcox, Samuel, Granted land on the eastern border of the Green Hills government precinct
Williams, Francis, Sydney merchant bought Thompson's ship Governor Bligh; leased *Killarney* farm
Williamson, James, Dinner guest of Bligh when he was arrested in 1808; witness at the 1811 trial
Wills, Eliza, Daughter of an emancipist who married Henry Antill in 1818
Wiltshire, James, Commissioner Palmer's clerk who was a witness at the 1811 England trial
Wimbow, John, Hawkesbury settler who was killed by Aborigines in 1799
Windham, William, Secretary of the Colonial Office in 1807
Woodbury, Richard, Convict servant who was the brewer at Thompson's brewery in 1806
Wright, Henry, Convicted of assaulting John Grono's daughter; sentenced to 3 years hard labour
Wright, Isobel, Wife of John Rae; threatened William Thompson's family
Wright, Richard, Personal convict servant of Andrew Thompson in 1806
Wylde, John, Judge Advocate appointed in 1816
York, Henry, Owned the first land that Thompson bought following the 1799 flood
Youler, Abraham, One of Thompson's three emancipist clerks in 1810
Young, Jean, Yetholm girl who married William Thompson in 1786
